## 2023 Legislative Agenda



CLRP is a statewide non-profit agency which provides legal services to low income adults with mental health conditions, who reside in hospitals or the community, on matters related to their treatment, recovery, and civil rights.

CLRP represents clients in accordance with their expressed preferences in administrative, judicial and legislative venues to enforce their legal rights and assure that personal choices are respected and individual self-determination is protected.

## **PRIORITIES**



Amend Patients' Bill of Rights to Reflect 21st Century
Communication Methods for People in Inpatient Psychiatric
Settings

Require inpatient psychiatric facilities to provide patients access to their personal cell phone and access to a computer and internet for email.



Increase On-Campus Vocational Opportunities for Long-Term Patients at Whiting Forensic Hospital

Provide funds in the state budget to hire additional vocational rehabilitation staff and to support increased job opportunities for forensic patients.



Equal Protection for Acquittees at End of Maximum Term of Commitment

Amend the Psychiatric Security Review Board statute to end re-commitment to the Board if an acquittee is still confined in a hospital at the end of their maximum term of commitment as set by the Superior Court.
